

The Japan Industrial Association of Electronic Article Surveillance Machines (JEAS) is an industrial association representing companies engaged in the manufacture, distribution, and support of Electronic Article Surveillance (EAS) systems and related loss prevention solutions. JEAS works in close cooperation with government agencies and related industrial organizations to promote sound business practices within the retail sector and to contribute to the prevention of juvenile delinquency. Through these activities, the Association fulfills both important industrial and social responsibilities.

Organization Overview

1 Founded in 2002, JEAS was officially recognized by Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) in 2018 as the industrial association for the Electronic Article Surveillance (EAS) and security camera sectors. In 2020, JEAS was accredited by the Personal Information Protection Commission (PPC) as an Authorized Personal Information Protection Organization. Today, the Association has grown to include 69 corporate members, representing a broad range of companies involved in the loss prevention and security systems industry.

2 JEAS is organized into four standing committees that conduct research, develop technical standards, and promote the safe and effective use of security equipment while supporting the healthy development of the market. In addition, the Association establishes specialized project teams to address emerging industry needs in a timely manner, such as the development of safety guidelines and standards for thermal imaging cameras and other advanced security technologies.

Safe Utilization of Camera Imaging Committee

The Committee studies the effective use of camera images and security measures in the retail and logistics sectors. By publishing sales and implementation guidelines for system providers, it helps create an environment that promotes the appropriate and responsible use of camera imaging technologies. In FY2016, the Committee published "Recommendations for the Safe Use of Security Cameras and Image Recognition Systems". In 2020, it launched the Recommended Facial Recognition System Certification Program.

Established in October 2008, the Technical Standards Committee was formed to develop and implement testing methods for evaluating electromagnetic interference between Electronic Article Surveillance (EAS) systems and medical devices.

- ③ Addressing compliance with Japan's Electrical Appliance and Material Safety Act
- ④ Developing technical standards and industry guidelines

- Scientific Security Certification Training Program (Administered by Scientific Security Training Project)

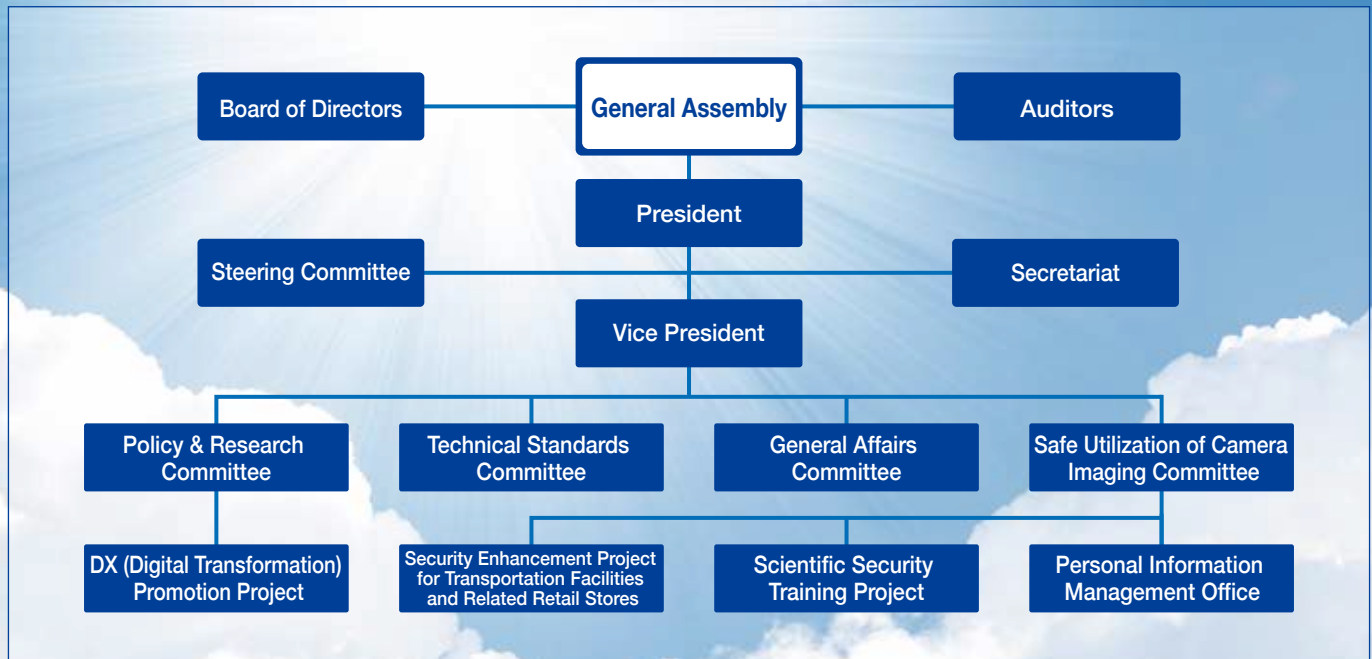
In addition, JEAS supports the Loss Prevention Specialist Certification Program operated by the National Shoplifting Crime Prevention Organization of Japan. As this program is considered an essential learning opportunity for JEAS members, JEAS provides support measures to encourage participation and expand the number of certified professionals.

With "Collaborative Crime Prevention" as its guiding principle, JEAS focuses on both strengthening dialogue with diverse stakeholders and improving practical capabilities in the field. Guided by the philosophy of "Think Globally, Act Locally," JEAS works closely with loss prevention organizations in the United States, China, and other countries while addressing emerging challenges such as organized retail crime and self-checkout fraud.
